Scrip orders are being taken by PTL. An order sheet was sent home earlier this week. Extra order forms are available in the school entrance. You can return your order to the school office. For those who are unfamiliar with Scrip, it is a program of purchasing Scrip (gift) cards in specific amounts, with different percentages of rebates coming back to the ALIS PTL. For example, a Wal-Mart gift card can be purchased for \$25 with 2% of the \$25 coming back to the PTL. It is an excellent way to make money for ALIS PTL. We also keep cards on hand. We have Wal-Mart (\$25 & \$100), Cracker Barrel (\$10), TGI Fridays (\$25), Marathon (\$25), Subway (\$10), and Walgreens (\$25). The local vendors we have on hand are Dairy Bar (\$25), Joe's Pizza (\$25), Niemerg's (\$25), Martin's IGA (\$25), The Home Center (\$25), and Culvers (\$10).
